

**THE CITY OF MONTREAL** was founded May 18th, 1642, by Paul de Chomedy, Sieur de Maisonneuve. It was incorporated in 1832.

**MONTREAL** has a population of 1,400,000 of which two-thirds are of French origin.

**MONTREAL** has a harbor 16 miles in length with a water area of 12,000 acres; 10 miles of piers and wharves with 60 miles of tracks and modern freight sheds covering an area of 2,226,000 sq. ft. Its 4 grain elevators have a storage capacity of 15,162,000 bushels.

**MONTREAL** is headquarters of I.C.A.O. and I.A.T.A. and Montreal Airport provides facilities for Trans-Canada, Colonial Airlines, B.O.A.C., Canadian Pacific, K.L.M., Royal Dutch, Air France and other lines linking Canada's metropolis with all parts of the world.

**MONTREAL** has an annual manufacturing output of two billion three hundred million dollars. It has 331 public schools, 2 technical and many private schools, English and French. It has in all 9 radio stations; English and French T.V. stations and 15 foreign language transmissions.

**MONTREAL** has 250 parks and public squares, covering 2,850 acres. The largest are Mount Royal, a delightful wooded area on the slopes of the mountain of the same name; St. Helen's Island in the middle of the St. Lawrence River; LaFontaine and Maisonneuve:

**MONTREAL** is situated at the head of ocean navigation and at the foot of a system of canals and waterways extending more than 1,200 miles into the heart of the continent. It is the world's greatest grain shipping seaport; the largest city in Canada and the second-largest French-speaking community of the world.

**MONTREAL** is the home of McGill University, world famous school of medicine and engineering, also the Université de Montréal, Canada's largest French-Canadian centre of culture.

**MONTREAL** has well been called "The Paris of America". It is the centre of entertainment and night life and is the only large city in America with complete facilities for all winter sports. Montreal's story is "A Tale of Two Cities" — English and French, modern and old — a never-ending source of excitement and gratification to the sightseer and tourist.







Seasoned travellers know well that cooperation with the Customs men of all countries begets cooperation. They are your friends, not your enemies and, within the limits of their duties, will meet friendship with friendship. Be frank. Be helpful. American or Canadian, the men in blue at the borderline are nice to know. You may take back to the United States merchandise to the value of \$200 once every thirty-one days, provided your stay in Canada has extended over 48 hours. Included in these happy duty and tax-free exemptions are tobacco, cigars (not over 100), foodstuffs and even one wine gallon of liquor.





Nice to Know

An additional exemption of \$300 is allowed once every six months, provided you have enjoyed 12 days or more of Canada's hospitality, not including day of arrival. If you have have bought anything at all in Canada, ask at the border for Form 6059 and claim the exemption to which you are entitled. Have your sales slips and purchase invoices ready. List your purchases before reaching the border. Pack your baggage to make inspection easy, even setting apart goods bought in Canada. The Customs men will appreciate your thoughtfulness and speed you on your way. Merchandise can be shipped, duty free, to a visitor's home anywhere in the United States.
